6- HIGHLIGHTS OF WHAT WAS SHARED BY OUR LOCAL FORMATION DIRECTORS

- Topics chosen from FUN Manual. Members prepared ahead to present.
- Fraternity Spiritual Assistant uses the **FUN Manual** for ongoing formation talks.
- **BOOKS:** A number of fraternities either have read or are reading a book together. A couple have started a book club. Some of the choices for books: St. Francis of Assisi: His Life, Teaching, and Practice, Jon Sweeney and Richard Rohr; Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist by Brant Pitre; Franciscan Prayer by Ilia Delio, OSF

(they coordinate this book with our Rule); DVD Praying the Gospels through Duns Scotus by Mary Beth Ingham; A Knight and a Lady: A Journey into the Spirituality of Saints Francis and Clare by Bret Thoman; also for use during initial formation by Thoman-- St. Francis of Assisi: Passion, Poverty, and the Man who Transformed the Catholic Church and St. Clare of Assisi: Light from the Cloister.

- **Initial formation classes** have continued--sometimes meeting in a candidate's house; on the phone; on Zoom; more than one class meeting in a large church hall. DETERMINATION!
- Fraternity has a committee (formation team) to plan ongoing formation sessions
- A number of fraternities use the **Formation Fridays** for ongoing formation. Sometimes they add research. One fraternity is going to print out some of the offerings and have partners volunteer to make the presentations.
- **PRAYER PARTNERS** partners get together every morning or evening to pray Morning or Evening prayer together. Very successful. Has made a big difference in the fraternity.
- Another fraternity gathers all those in initial formation (aspirants, inquirers, and candidates) to pray Evening Prayer every Friday.
- One older fraternity has had an ongoing formation on the history of the fraternity. (sounds like a wonderful idea!)
- A fraternity sends a **pamphlet to homebound members** and those who either cannot attend in person or on Zoom giving them a taste of the ongoing formation material that was covered at the meeting.
- One fraternity has initiated a study of Memoriale Propositi with a comparison to our present Rule of 1978
- A number of fraternities are doing studies of the Rule and encouraging members to read the Rule during their prayer time.
- A formation leader invites professed fraternity members to stop by formation sessions to introduce themselves to the inquirers and candidates.
- A fraternity has included various ministries as part of the initial formation program
- They have also planned to have every member invite one family member or friend who is no longer a practicing Catholic to attend a fraternity gathering
- Fraternities are using DVDs by Brother Bill Short, OFM, available on Now You Know Media (Learn 25)
- One fraternity downloaded the videos of our last two retreats when they were available online. They view parts of them at meetings and discuss
- Two fraternities use PowerPoint presentations that I developed using the material from the Franciscan Journey and the FUN Manual. (If you would like to see these, I would be happy to send you a link.)
